A scholarship is a type of financial aid offered by many nonprofit and private organizations to help students pay for college or further training. This type of aid is considered "free money," meaning students do not have to repay it.

Provide students with a basic overview and any additional documents that the organization may require to complete the application process. These documents may include:


- Personal Statement or Essay

for students attending a two-year or four-year college/university

Alpha Delta Kappa Virginia Gamma Omicron Scholarship

for students who plan to attend a two-year or four-year college university that plan to pursue a career in education

Armstrong Foundation Scholarship

for students attending a two-year or four-year college/university, trade school, based on need, school and community service, extra-curricular activities

Bob Messa Agricultural Foundation Scholarship

for students who plan to pursue a career in farming or agriculture

Charlottesville Track Club Skip Kinnier Scholarship

for students who plan to attend a 2 or 4 year college. Students must have been members of their school cross country or track teams or participated in the Charlottesville Track Club event within the past year

Culpeper Soil & Water Conservation Scholarship

for students who plan to pursue a career in a conservation-related field

Culpeper Wellness Foundation Health & Wellness Scholarship

for students who are accepted into a health or wellness related certificate or degree program at Germanna Community College

for students who plans to attend an accredited college, university, or community college

for students who plan to attend a two-year or four-year college/university with propriety to be given to candidates pursuing a career in Education

Ella G. Agnew Scholarship

for students planning to further their education in a nursing career or in a field related to the medical profession **Earle H. Blankenbaker Scholarship**

for students who plan to attend a two-year or four-year college/university. First priority will be given to candidates who intend to pursue a career in education

for students who plan to attend a two-year or four-year college/university and study the human services field (Ex. Psychology, Sociology, Socio

for students planning to study at a four-year accredited college or university

for students who plan to pursue a career in education

George E. Allen Scholarship

for students who plan to pursue nursing, business, or trade/technical training at a two-year, four-year college/university, or technical/trade school

George Washington Carver Scholarship

for students who plan to attend a two-year or four-year college/university. Particularly those of African American descent and those who demonstrate financial need

for students who plan to attend a two-year, four-year college/university, or technical school

Haley Collier Memorial Scholarship

for students attending a two-year or four-year college/university, trade school, based on need, school and community service, extra-curricular activities

James S. Blankenbaker Scholarship

for students pursuing technical or trade education, but other fields of study are considered

John R. Lillard Foundation, Inc. Aviation Scholarship

for students who plan to pursue a career in the aviation field

Joyce Lindsey Scholarship

for students pursuing a career and technical education occupational goal

Kenneth R. Scott Aviation Scholarship

for students who plan to pursue a career in the aviation field

Lane E. Warren Scholarship

for students either college bound or will study in a certificate program

Living the Dream Scholarship

for students pursuing a degree in counseling, education, behavioral science, medical, social work, psychological or other degrees that could be used to help others

Lynne Goldsborough Yowell Scholarship

for students pursuing an Arts Major (visual arts, music, theater arts, culinary arts, or study/career in the creative arts)

Madison American Legion Educational Scholarship

for students who plans to attend a 2 or 4 year college/university or a trade school

Madison Chapter FFA Scholarship

for students who will further his or her education in an agricultural related field at a college/university, technical or community college

Madison County Democratic Committee 2024 Rural Land Steward Scholarship

for students planning to attend a two-year or four-year accredited secondary institution in the upcoming fall, or pursue a career in farming, land conversation and/or environmental stewardship requiring additional training/education

Madison County Education Foundation Robert Chappell Memorial Scholarship

for students attending a two-year or four-year college/university, trade school, based on need, school and community service, extra-curricular activities

Madison County Farm Bureau Scholarship

for students attending a two-year or four-year college/university

Madison County Library Inc. Chris Jacoby Textbook Scholarship

for students attending a two-year or four-year college/university

Madison County Sheriff's Office Bunkie Eanes D.A.R.E Memorial Scholarship

for students who are pursuing to attend an accredited non-profit college, university, or vocation/technical school

Madison Strong Scholarship

for students who plan to pursue a career as a first responder (law enforcement, fire, EMS, social work, or 911 communications), or a graduating senior who is currently a volunteer First Responder in Madison County and plans to pursue college or trade school in any field

Martha Mae Giles Scholarship

for students attending a two-year or four-year college/university. First priority is given to members or children of members of Our Savior Lutheran Church of Warrenton, VA

Maude E. Wallace Scholarship

for students attending a two-year or four-year college/university to further their education in any field of study

NAACP Culpeper Branch #7058 Scholarship

for students of color, applicants who face financial or personal hardships, who will attend accredited trade, vocational, and technical schools; community colleges; or four-year colleges and universities

Old Rag Master Naturalists Scholarship

for students who are pursuing a bachelor's degree in Wildlife/Natural Resources Conservation/Environmental Studies at a college/university

Pop Pop's Concession Scholarship

for students who will be attending a Career Certificate Program, Career or Technical Program, Trade School with a focus in a CTE Field

Rappahannock Electric Cooperative Scholarship

for students who are seeking to advance their career goals by attending a college/university or a career/technical school

Rich Murray Journalism Scholarship

for students who are pursuing a college degree in journalism, communications or a related field, preferably at an institution in Virginia

Rochelle Ruritan Club Scholarship

for students attending a two-year or four-year college/university, trade school, based on need, school and community service, extra-curricular activities

Sally Lamb Scholarship

for students accepted at any two-year, four-year college, or trade school program

St. Luke's Foundation Scholarship

for student's resident of Culpeper, Fauquier, Madison, or Rappahannock counties, and are alumni of any private school in Culpeper County, although priority is given to St. Luke's alumni

UVa Community Credit Union Scholarship

graduating senior attending any public, private, or home-school located within their membership area

UVa Heath Pat & Frank Dawson Scholarship

for students must have actively participated in the UVA Junior Volunteer Program and have been accepted into a healthcare degree program

Virginia Bankers Association Bank Day Scholarship Program

Virginia Federation of Garden Clubs Scholarship

for students who are pursuing a college degree in a garden-related field

for seniors who are active in a Madison County 4-H Program Wetsel Memorial Scholarship

for students going to a two-year and four-year college/university

Willard G. Plentl Sr. Aviation Scholarship

for students who plan to pursue a career in the aviation field Windmore Foundation for the Arts Scholarship
