Tardy Policy

First Tardy to Class: Warning and teacher speaks to student

Second tardy to Class: Warning and teacher contacts parent

Third tardy: Teacher contacts parent and assigns one day of lunch detention

Subsequent tardies: Teacher contacts parent and writes a referral, student serves one hour of After-School Detention, after school detention and parent conference with administration.

Grading

Grades are calculated as follows:

- Classwork/Homework = 20%
- Quizzes = 30%
- Tests = 50%

Grades will be updated in Power School within one week, with the exception of projects or lengthy writing assignments.

Late Daily Homework

6th Grade:

Homework, Class Work, Projects/Writing Prompts:

- Lose **5 points** per day late with a maximum penalty of 20 points
- Not turned in by the end of the 9 weeks reporting period (0% F)
